Just Got Home Service

Do you have concerns about returning home after being in hospital?

Our 'Just Got Home' service offers a follow up home visit to provide you with information and help to arrange access to services on your behalf.

Provided in partnership between New Forest District Council and New Forest Disability, 'Just Got Home' is a free service, and available to in-patients at Lymington New Forest Hospital.

We understand that some patients may have concerns about returning home, particularly if they are feeling isolated.

To offer support, we have put in place our 'Just Got Home' service, where patients will be offered a follow-up home visit by our team at New Forest Disability.

The service is free and available to in-patients at Lymington New Forest Hospital.

Patients wishing to use this service will be contacted within two weeks of returning home to arrange a convenient day and time for us to visit.

Patients will be visited by the person they met while on the ward so they will know exactly who to expect.



Our 'Just Got Home' service offers a follow up home visit to provide you with information and help to arrange access to services on your behalf.

During the visit we can provide information on:

- Transport solutions
- Equipment
- Benefits
- Social activities
- Befriending
- Lunch clubs
- Disabled access
- Sports activities
- Day centres
- Escorted trips out

We can also help to arrange access to these services on your behalf.

Independence Matters

Do you have difficulty using your bath, or find stairs and steps tricky?

New Forest District Council has linked up with New Forest Disability, to promote adaptations to help people stay independent in their homes.

What we can help with

Funding is available to assist New Forest residents with a disability, to live safely, independently and with dignity in their own homes. We can help with a wide range of adaptations, including:

- Installing a level access shower.
- Widening doors for wheelchair access.
- Fitting grab rails, ramps or stair lifts.

We can also assist with arranging a needs assessment, surveyor and builder to carry out the work.

Loans are also available to help with essential work such as roof and window repairs or a broken boiler. Loans are administered by the Parity Trust, a charitable organisation.
