Chairman's Report

Far from the 'weathering the storm' I am very please to report this year has been a year of 'growth and development'. The last twelve months have been positive times for looking forwards and onwards. As a Board we have consolidated and now have John Woolhouse as Treasurer which has been a very important addition, and I am very pleased to announce how well I feel supported by my team of board members.

At the same time I think it important to acknowledge the hard work of our officers and in recognition of this, and our developments, we have now have a Chief Executive in Jacki Keable and an Outreach Manager, Cathy Gogan, who have been instrumental in enabling these developments to happen.

It is with great delight we have been able to appoint Josey Carpenter, as Office Administrator, to support Cathy and Jacki. This has been badly needed, and she has already proved to be a great asset to the team.

Grants have improved this year and we have started doing pilot work for Adult Services, which not only provides a very important service but enables us to develop these services in partnership with our colleagues in Adult Services. While Cathy has lead the development of work at Lymington hospital, Jane has now been able to use her Occupational Therapy skills assessing people in the community for equipment.

The office and shop are now open 10am to 5pm Monday to Friday and Saturday mornings and the selling of new and second hand equipment has seen another great development which is supporting the growing needs of the population of the area.

It is with great commitment that our wider Outreach work continues to provide a valuable service and without our volunteers we would be unable to support all these developments and maintain the wider support we give people.

I am very proud to be linked with such a developing service which provides such a quality service to our users. This year has seen the organisation become more robust and positive. It is not easy for voluntary services and we are in no way complacent about the challenges ahead but we are well on the way.

Next year we look forward to ongoing development and consolidation in order to provide a very valued service to people with disabilities in the New Forest.

chart a: number of clients, enquiries, client contacts & hours used.




chart b: %client contacted for themselves/another

chart c: % client female/male






chart e: % clients for children, adults, OAPs




chart d: %clients are disabled, carers, professionals, other




chart g: amount of new benefit raised for clients per annum




chart h: client method of initial contact





chart i: client enquiries by topic



The Travelling Service

We continue our commitment to taking our Service out into the community where we see individuals who may be unable to visit our Head Office or one of our Outreach Offices. Take up has been sporadic however, and we have not been as busy as we would have liked over the past year. We plan to address this over the coming year by promoting the Service via further advertising and targeting all the groups, GP practices, churches etc that we have visited in the past.

We visit Fordingbridge, Ringwood, Totton, Hythe and Blackfield libraries and the GP Surgeries at Bransgore and Barton-on-Sea on a regular basis throughout the year where we offer free information and advice.

The Outreach Service

Despite difficulties due to sickness and retirement of a long serving and much missed member of staff, we continue to provide a weekly service at both Ringwood and Hythe where we offer not only information and guidance but welfare benefit support as well.

An exciting opportunity saw us extending this process in January 2009 into Lymington New Forest Hospital where for two hours each day we visit patients and their families offering guidance and advice and assistance with completing benefit forms. To the end of March we saw 91 clients and we are improving upon this number week by week.
